STUDENT EXPENSE BUDGETS**

These budgets, along with your Expected Family Contribution (EFC), are used to determine your financial aid eligibility for the 2009-2010 school year. The EFC comes from FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) information.

Budget-EFC=Financial Need

These budgets are based on estimated costs for the regular fall-spring school year. The costs are estimates and may differ from student to student, but this is intended to give you the approximate costs of attending CR.

Fees are based on the average full-time enrollment of 14 units per semester (for CA residents). Minimum full-time enrollment is 12 units per semester.

Non-resident tuition is based on 12 units per semester at \$226 per unit.

*Students determined eligible for the Oregon Exchange program pay \$61 per unit in addition to CA enrollment fees, rather than the non-resident fees.
