

**2019 – 2020
 Cost of Attendance (Budget/Expenses)**

The expenses listed below are estimated costs for attending College of the Redwoods & are intended to give you a general idea about cost & help determine your financial aid awards. **These costs are approximate and will differ from student to student based on enrollment & individual choices.**

Financial aid rarely covers all costs, so be prepared to pay a portion yourself. You need to have money up front to pay for books/supplies etc., even if you expect to receive financial aid. All financial aid will go toward balances owed to CR (tuition/fees, housing costs, etc.) first. No funds are disbursed to you unless all money owed to CR is paid in full.

*On Campus housing charges include \$4644 in housing costs & \$3745 in meal plan costs.

The Cost of Attendance (COA) above reflects the cost of one academic year. Your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is calculated based on the information provided on your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Most financial aid awards are based on Financial Need, which is the difference between your COA & EFC. In most cases, your awards cannot exceed your Financial Need; however, this does not mean you will necessarily receive financial aid equal to your Financial Need.

Fees for ALL students are based on full-time enrollment (12 units per semester) at \$46 per unit, plus semester fees (\$20 health fee, \$10 student fee, \$10 technology fee). 24 units per year x \$46 per unit + \$80 = \$1184. If you enroll in more than 12 units per semester, your costs will be higher.

****Both non-residents & OR Exchange students pay these fees (\$1184 per year depending on enrollment) & pay an additional amount as shown below:**

- **Non-resident tuition** is based on full-time enrollment at \$266 per unit (24 units per year x \$266 per unit = \$6384). If you enroll in more than 12 units per semester, your costs will be higher.
- **Approved Oregon (OR) Exchange tuition** is based on full-time enrollment at \$73 per unit (24 units per year x \$73 per unit = \$1752) rather than the non-resident fees. If you enroll in more than 12 units per semester, your costs will be higher.

Costs for books, supplies, food, housing (other than on campus), transportation, & miscellaneous are all approximate and will change based on individual student choices such as buying or renting text books, etc.

Note: The costs listed above for fees, non-resident/OR exchange tuition, & residence halls are subject to change without notice. The non-resident & Oregon exchange fees include a per unit capital outlay fee.
