ANNUAL MILITARY EQUIPMENT REPORT

OF THE

COLLEGE OF THE REDWOODS POLICE DEPARTMENT

Pursuant to Government Code § 7070, § 7071; and § 7072; the College of the Redwoods Police Department maintains an inventory of tools classified as Military Equipment. In compliance with these Government Code sections, the CRPD provides the District with a Military Equipment Use Policy (Government Code § 7070(d)) and an Annual Military Equipment Report (Government Code § 7072(a)). These documents provide mandated information regarding the CRPD military equipment in inventory.

Cal. Gov. Code 7072

- (a) A law enforcement agency that receives approval for a military equipment use policy pursuant to Section 7071 shall submit to the governing body an annual military equipment report for each type of military equipment approved by the governing body within one year of approval, and annually thereafter for as long as the military equipment is available for use. The law enforcement agency shall also make each annual military equipment report required by this section publicly available on its internet website for as long as the military equipment is available for use. The annual military equipment report shall, at a minimum, include the following information for the immediately preceding calendar year for each type of military equipment:
 - (1) A summary of how the military equipment was used and the purpose of its use.
 - (2) A summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning the military equipment.
 - (3) The results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the military equipment use policy, and any actions taken in response.
 - (4) The total annual cost for each type of military equipment, including acquisition, personnel, training, transportation, maintenance, storage, upgrade, and other ongoing costs, and from what source funds will be provided for the military equipment in the calendar year following submission of the annual military equipment report.
 - (5) The quantity possessed for each type of military equipment.
 - (6) If the law enforcement agency intends to acquire additional military equipment in the next year, the quantity sought for each type of military equipment.

All sworn members of the CRPD are qualified with this weapon on 11-4-24, prior to it being put into service. No situations arose in 2024 requiring its use beyond training and qualification.

4	The initial cost of this equipment was \$1,268. ¹⁴ . The estimated annual maintenance cost is approximately \$30. ⁰⁰ . The estimated annual training cost for this equipment is approximately \$100. ⁰⁰ . All funding for this equipment is a component of the CRPD annual operating budget.

	officers with options when confronting assaultive individuals. All sworn members of the		
	CRPD are qualified with these rounds on 11-4-24. No situations arose in 2024 requiring		
	round deployment beyond training and qualification.		
2	There were no complaints regarding this equipment in 2024.		
3	There were no violations of the military equipment use policy regarding this equipment in		
	2024.		
4	The initial cost of this equipment was \$383.00. The estimated annual training/depletion cost		
	for this equipment is approximately \$100.00 as identified above in the previous section of this		
	report. All funding for this equipment is a component of the CRPD annual operating budget.		
5	CRPD possesses approximately twenty-five (25) rounds.		
6	CRPD does not plan to acquire additional rounds in 2025.

Equi	Equipment Name: Daniel Defense DDM4 PDW Short Barrel Rifle (SBR)			
1	These weapons allow sworn members of the CRPD to intercede in violent confrontations where lethal force is necessary to end the threat to human life. They provide greater accuracy and increased ballistic capabilities than standard handgun rounds. These weapons did not become serviceable in 2024 due to their acquisition at the end of the calendar year.			
2	There were no complaints regarding this equipment in 2024.			
3	There were no violations of the military equipment use policy regarding this equipment in 2024.			

- The initial cost of this equipment was \$5,193.80. The estimated annual maintenance cost is approximately \$60.00. The estimated annual training cost for this equipment is approximately \$1000.00. These costs are a total for all units possessed. All funding for this equipment is a component of the CRPD annual operating budget.

	SBRs identified above. The rounds are intended to allow sworn members of the CRPD to			
	intercede in violent confrontations where lethal force is necessary to end the threat to			
	human life. The ammunition provides greater accuracy and increased ballistic capabilities			
	over standard handgun rounds. These weapons and the associated ammunition did not			
	become serviceable in 2024 due to their acquisition at the end of the calendar year.			
2	There were no complaints regarding this equipment in 2024.			
3	There were no violations of the military equipment use policy regarding this equipment in			
	2024.			
4	The initial cost of this ammunition was \$5,108.70. The estimated annual training/depletion			
	cost for this equipment is approximately \$1000.00 as identified above in the previous section			
	of this report. Funding for this ammunition is a component of the CRPD annual operating			
	budget.			
5	CRPD possesses approximately 2500 rounds of subsonic ammunition and 800 rounds of			
	supersonic ammunition.			
6	CRPD does not plan to acquire more of this ammunition in 2025.
