Dental Assisting Program Application Filing Period:

Applications are accepted February 1st through August 1st each academic year.

Eligible applications are accepted on a first-come-first-served basis. Incomplete applications will not be processed.

Dental Assisting Program Information:

Accreditation:

The Dental Assisting Program at College of the Redwoods is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association (CODA) and approved by the Dental Board of California (DBC). This allows graduates to be eligible for the Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) exam, for State licensure, and the Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) exam, for National certification.

Schedule:

The Dental Assisting Program is offered each academic year, beginning in the fall semester, 990 hours are completed, including 330 clinical hours. The Dental Assisting Program at College of the Redwoods is a full-time/full-load commitment, 5 days a week. Class are Monday- Friday approximately from 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM daily. Students enrolled in the Program begin each semester early.

Dental Assisting Program Eligibility:

- Applicants must have a valid Student Identification Number from College of the Redwoods.
 - Eligible applicants *must* have a College of the Redwoods student identification number. This requires applicants to additionally apply to the College, an application can be completed online at <u>College of the Redwoods Admissions</u> and a student identification number will be emailed.
- Applicants must include college transcripts or high school diploma or equivalency.
 - Eligible applicants *must* include official college or high school transcripts or equivalency, such as a GED attached to this application for acceptance into the Dental Assisting Program. Transcripts can be posted "in-progress". This is an accreditation standard requirement of the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association.
- Applicants must have a satisfactory cumulative Grade Point Average meeting or exceeding a 2.0.

Eligible applicants *must* be in good academic standing. Students on Academic Probation, Level 1, Level 2, or students dismissed from the College due to unsatisfactory academic performance are not eligible for the Program.

Dental Assisting Program Requirements:

Acceptance:

Students accepted in the Program will be notified by letter in mid-May. This is done by certified mail and is sent to the address indicated on the application. Additionally, information is sent to your College of the Redwoods email. Accepted students are automatically registered in the Dental Assisting Program courses by the Program Coordinator and are required to attend orientation.

Mandatory Orientation:

Students are required to successfully pass DA 150, Dental Assisting Program Orientation, satisfying all requirements. Orientation is held one week prior to the beginning of school. At orientation students will complete the required CPR training, pay additional fees, and receive further information about the required dental supply kit requirement to purchase within the first two weeks of school.

Fees:

Students are responsible for paying all registration fees through <u>Webadvisor</u> and/or through <u>Financial Aid disbursements</u>. Students failing to do so will be dropped by Admissions, positions are not held. Additionally, students will be required to pay extra fees for the required uniform and supplies, a complete breakdown of estimated costs has been included in the application for your review.

Education Plan:

Students are strongly advised to meet with an Advisor to create an Education Plan prior to applying. This will assist the student in knowing which education pathway is appropriate. To qualify for graduation, employment, and licensure students must complete Nutrition (HO15) and a communications studies course (COMMC1000- Introduction to Public Speaking *or* COMM6-Small Group *or* COMM7-Interpersonal Communication *or* COMM8-Intercultural Communication. These classes may be taken prior to enrollment in the Dental Assisting Program courses or concurrently while enrolled in the Dental Assisting Program.

Dental Assisting Program Requirements Continued:

Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure:

Students participating in the Dental Assisting Program curriculum have the potential for occupational exposure. Students can be exposed to bloodborne pathogens through direct or indirect contact. Risk for droplet infection through per mucosal (contact with mucous membranes, such as mouth, nose, and eyes) or percutaneous infection (through the skin, such as cut, needle stick, and puncture) exists due to the nature of clinical dental assisting. Students are routinely exposed to blood and saliva and are determined to be Category 1, requiring all Standard Precautions and the use of Personal Protective Equipment or attire. Due to the potential risk of infection, students are strongly advised to have current vaccinations and the flu shot. Please note due to the nature of dental assisting students can be exposed to both bacterial and viral infections such as Covid-19, H1N1 Flu Virus, HIV, Hepatitis A – E, Herpesviruses, Tuberculosis, Legionnaires' Disease, Tetanus, Methicillin-Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus (MRSA), etc. This is the nature of the occupation, and students participate at their own risk.

Additionally, students participating in the curriculum have the potential to encounter hazardous chemicals and radiation exposure.

Physical Examination Clearance and Vaccination Records:

Students enrolled in the Dental Assisting Program will need to have a completed physical exam and submit a Medical Clearance Form completed by a physician, physician's assistant, or family nurse practitioner. Additionally, due to the risk of communicable disease proof of immunity for Hepatis B (3 doses), Measles, Mumps, Rubella-MMR (2 doses depending on age and vaccination timing), Varicella (2 doses or history of chickenpox documented by healthcare provide), Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis- Tdap(1 dose) and TST-TB Skin Test or IGRA -TB Blood test for tuberculosis no more than 6 months are required to participate in the Dental Assisting Program as a full-time student. Yearly, flu vaccinations are not required but recommended.

Dental Examination Clearance:

Students enrolled in the Dental Assisting Program will be evaluated by the College of the Redwood Dental Health Center dentist. This includes x-rays. Students must have clearance prior to participating in laboratory activities scheduled for mid-fall semester.

Students needing urgent care due to dental neglect such as abscesses, loose teeth, gross caries, and advanced periodontal disease will be referred to a local dentist and/or clinic and will be responsible for the cost incurred due to treatment. For safety and risk liability issues a student presenting the conditions listed above will not be able to participate in laboratory activities until treatment is sufficient for clearance from the student's dentist. This can result in insufficient hours to complete the program.

Dress Code:

Students enrolled in the Dental Assisting Program are enrolled in a professional program where students participate in a place of business other than the College. Uniform and business attire must be clean, and in good repair. Additionally, dental assisting program students must follow Center for Disease Control Guidelines and must not wear acrylic nails or nail polish. Make-up must be discrete, tattoos covered, and jewelry/ piercings are limited to one per ear and others cannot be worn during lab and clinical setting. Hair must be conventional, clean, pulled back and extremes such as bright colors or neon avoided.

Employment:

Graduates' employment rates are exceptional! According to the US Department of Labor, dental assistants are expected to be among the fastest growing occupations. We work closely with our local dental community to provide internship and jobs opportunities for our students.
