RN Program Admission Overview

- **Responsibility:** Admission criteria may change annually. Applicants are responsible for meeting **current requirements and deadlines**.
- Program Approval: The CR RN program is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) and awards an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN).
 Graduates are eligible to take the NCLEX-RN for licensure.
- Selection Process: Class selection follows a multi-criteria screening process in accordance with California Education Code 78261.

Points are awarded for:

- Academic performance
- Work or volunteer experience
- Language proficiency (other than English)
- Life experiences or special circumstances
- Diagnostic assessment (ATI TEAS)
- Admission: Highest scoring eligible applicants are offered admission. Ties are broken by computerized random selection.
- Waitlist: There is no waitlist. Applicants not admitted must reapply in a future cycle.
- NCLEX Pass Rates: CR RN Program Pass Rates

Important Dates and information

- December 31, 2025: Deadline to complete prerequisites
- January 9, 2026 at 11:00 a.m.: Complimentary TEAS test (first-time test takers only)

We encourage students to be well prepared by completing prerequisites, using ATI study materials, and taking Math 207 if needed. Preparation significantly improves test performance.

TEAS Re-Test Policy:

Re-testing cannot be done at CR. Students must re-test directly through ATI at their own expense, and an approved TEAS Remediation Form must be on file before any re-test attempt.

Application Timeline for Fall 2026

- February 1–15: Applications accepted
- February 15: Deadline to submit official transcripts from all colleges attended
- March 16: Eligibility status and point allocation emailed
- April 1: Deadline to appeal eligibility status or dispute points
- April 15: Appeal notifications and seat offers sent
- May 18: Mandatory in-person orientation on the Eureka campus

College of the Redwoods – RN Program Application Instructions

1. College Application & Student Email

- Applicants must be **admitted to College of the Redwoods (CR)** and have a **CR Student ID** before submitting the RN application.
 - Apply here: **CR Apply**
- Students who have **not attended CR for 2+ semesters** must reapply before submitting the RN application.
- All communication will be sent **only to your CR email**. Personal emails are not accepted.
- **Update Personal Information:** Any changes to name, address, phone, or email must be reported to **HealthOcc@redwoods.edu**. Changes in CR Admissions do **not** update your RN application.
- Check your CR email frequently for updates, deadlines, and important notices.

2. Transcript Requirements

- Submit **official**, **current transcripts** from all colleges attended (except CR).
- Transcripts must be from regionally accredited U.S. colleges/universities.
- Courses previously submitted as in-progress must be resubmitted after completion.
- Submission Options:
 - Electronic via Parchment to <u>Nursing-Applications@redwoods.edu</u> (Do not send to general CR Admissions email)
 - Hand-delivered sealed transcripts to the Health Occupations Office (call 707-476-4216 to schedule).
- International Transcripts: Must be evaluated by an approved service. More info

3. Prerequisite Coursework

All prerequisites must be completed by Dec 31, 2025. In-progress courses will not be accepted.

Requirements:

- Minimum **2.5 GPA** in science courses and overall college GPA.
- C- or lower grades are not accepted.
- Consult the CR Catalog or Counseling for additional degree requirements.

4. ATI TEAS Assessment

Passing ATI TEAS Assessment (Version 7) is required for admission.

Requirements:

- Test Version: ATI TEAS Version 7 only
 Passing Score: Minimum 62% composite
- Recency: Test within 3 years of application deadline
- Submission: TEAS score must be submitted with the application (Feb 1–15, 2026)
- Official Transcript: ATI must send it to nursing-applications@redwoods.edu

Retesting / Remediation:

- Scores <62% require remediation and ATI TEAS Exam Remediation/Retest Approval Request before retesting
- Scores >62% may also be improved with the same form
- Minimum 90-day interval between attempts
- If the form is not submitted, the **first score** will be used

5. RN Program Application

- Complete the **online RN application** with all supporting documentation by **the application** deadline.
- Incomplete applications or missing documents will **not be accepted**.
- Print and save a copy for your records.
- Do not submit applications via mail or general email.

Application Attachments

- Each attachment must be combined into a single PDF file and saved using the following naming convention:
 - LAST NAME, FIRST NAME TITLE OF DOCUMENT
 - o Example:
 - Smith, John TEAS Transcript

6. Program Ineligibility

Applicants will be **ineligible for admission** if any of the following apply:

1. **GPA/Grades**:

- Combined science GPA <2.5 (no rounding)
- o Grade below C in any prerequisite
- Overall GPA <2.5

2. Transcripts:

- Failure to submit **official, current, sealed transcripts** from all colleges attended (excluding CR) by the deadline (transcripts need to be send to <u>nursing-applications@redwoods.edu</u> NOT the general CR admissions email.
- Prerequisites completed at non-accredited U.S. institutions or international courses **not** evaluated by ACEI or IERF

3. ATI TEAS Assessment:

- o Score below 62% or failure to remediate
- o TEAS score not attached to the application

4. Application Completion:

- Incomplete applications
- o Failure to meet deadlines or respond to time-sensitive emails

5. Student Account Holds:

- Any hold on your CR student account will block progression in the RN application process.
