Catalog Description

An introduction to the elements and principles upon which two-dimensional art forms are structured. Concepts covered include line, shape, value, composition, space, texture, and color theory. Media used include drawing, painting, and collage.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- 1. Draw, paint, and collage proficiently using a wide range of two-dimensional art media and techniques, including graphite, ink, acrylic paint, and collage.
- Create artworks that successfully demonstrate the expressive and experimental characteristics of line, shape, composition (including balance, unity, variety, focal point, and visual movement), as well as texture, value, color theory (including complementary contrast, simultaneous contrast, warm and cool colors, and color symbolism) and spatial illusion.
- 3. Create artworks that successfully evaluate and respond to historical, contemporary, multicultural, and interdisciplinary materials, concepts, and approaches in two-dimensional art forms.
- Evaluate and critically assess class projects and artworks presented in lectures, using relevant terminology in oral or written formats.

Prerequisites/co-requisites/ recommended preparation: None

Course Requirements: There will be 6 <u>full</u> hours per week of lectures, demonstrations, critiques, and intensive art making. Your total involvement in each of these activities is absolutely required. In addition to in-class work, you'll need to spend approximately 3 hours per week outside of class finishing projects and watching video lectures and demonstrations for each assignment. Additionally, there will be 3 group critiques during the semester and 8 short quizzes to take for each project lecture. You will also be required to bring specific supplies to each class meeting. These supplies are listed in the calendar, on this syllabus, and on Canvas. Should the calendar for this syllabus change due to extenuating or other circumstances, I will issue you an addendum so that you'll always know what we are doing (and what you'll need) on each day we meet. Plenty of critical course information (including video lectures, video demonstrations, quizzes, additional readings and grading rubrics) is located on Canvas, and you will be submitting assignments and taking quizzes through Canvas too. Access to a computer with internet is essential for this course, as is having a smart phone with a decent camera. Please see me if this is impossible for you.

How I Grade Your Assignments: When I evaluate your work, I am looking to see that your work satisfactorily reflects the Student Learning Outcomes listed for this course: in sum, that you are demonstrating understanding and proficiency with the drawing, painting, collage, and digital materials, techniques, and concepts that are covered in the lectures, demonstrations, and critiques in this class, and also that you have spent the sufficient allocated time on each project. If you must miss a class, you'll need to complete at least 3 hours of outside work per missed class. You also must show me your makeup work before it is submitted for grading, so I can make sure that you have done it correctly and that you have spent sufficient time on it to get full credit for it. You'll be submitting your in-progress and completed projects at the end of each class period to the "Assignments" section on Canvas. I will give you points for each submission, and (in the process) Canvas will automatically calculate your overall grade in the "Grades" section. Feel free to check your grades there, and feel free to ask me about your grade and/or your progress in this class at any time.

Class Participation and Conduct: It is absolutely crucial to your grade that you show up to class with all your supplies, participate fully, and work diligently for the entire class period. You must also prepare for each class class by watching each assigned video lecture and demonstration <u>before</u> each relevant project and class meeting. Arriving late or leaving early from class will lower the points you receive for each assignment. Chatting and/or not working during our work sessions will also lower the points for each assignment. Be aware that if you miss more than 7 class sessions at any point during the semester, you will be dropped from this course for excessive absences

and non-participation. Finally, *I insist upon a professional and studious atmosphere in all my courses.* If you consistently arrive late or leave early, chat during work sessions, distract other students, or somehow lower the concentration level of the classroom—you will be strongly discouraged from taking this course. This course is for serious students, but don't worry if you feel you have little skill at art. Give me 100% of your involvement, be willing to do your best, and you should have no problem succeeding in this course!

It is crucial to your grade that you show up with all of your supplies, participate fully, and work diligently for the entire class period.

Bringing Supplies: No textbook is required for this course, but specific art materials are absolutely required. The supplies you will need each week are listed in each Project description, on the course calendar, and also described in the video demonstrations. **You must bring the required art supplies to each class session**, as I will not be providing materials. If you come to class empty-handed, you will be counted absent for that day. Also: do not mooch supplies off of classmates! Please see me if you are missing a few items.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

1. Drawing Supplies: F, 2B, and 4B drawing pencils (*Tombow, Derwent, Staedtler*, or *Faber-Castell* brands)

Pen and ink set or Sharpie markers or Sakura Micron Pens (05 is good)

A small set of *Prismacolor* (or *Derwent*) colored pencils Eraser (white *Magic Rub* is good—or a grey kneadable)

A small handheld pencil sharpener

2. <u>Paints</u> (acrylic): Hansa, Azo, or Cadmium Yellow <u>Light</u> (be sure that it is <u>a very light</u>, <u>cool</u> yellow)

Ultramarine Blue (red shade, if possible) Pthalo Blue (green shade, if possible)

Quinacridone Red (be sure that it is a very cool magenta red)

Ivory or Mars Black Titanium White

3. <u>Mediums</u>: Small bottle of Acrylic Gloss Medium or Slow Dry Acrylic Glazing Medium

4. <u>Brushes</u>: A set of watercolor or acrylic brushes: 1 flat about 3/4" wide, one round about 1/4"

wide, and a good quality very fine detail brush (about size #0 or #1)

5. Other Supplies: Seven 15"x20" illustration boards, *vellum* finish preferred

1 sheet of heavy weight Bristol Board, vellum finish (9"x12")

9"x12" sketch pad or scratch paper 9"x12" tracing paper, a couple of sheets An enamel butcher tray or disposable palette
