Catalog Description

This survey of visual art from the Prehistory to the Gothic places emphasis on Western art. Topics explored include an artwork's cultural and historical context, particular periods and styles.

- 1. Identify a broad range of processes and materials used to create works of art in the West from prehistory through the medieval period.
- 2. Analyze visual or formal structure in works of two-dimensional and three-dimensional art and architecture.
- **3.** Identify subject matter and iconography in both western and non-western works of art from the prehistory through the medieval period.
- 4. Analyze, discuss and differentiate works of art within their cultural context.

Canvas

Online course

This class takes place completely online. Discussions, quizzes and exams will be hosted on Canvas. Lectures are recorded and will be posted as links on Canvas and to the class Youtube channel each Wednesday and Friday.

Nonparticipation policy

If you have failed to log in to Canvas and/or failed to submit a response for 50 percent or more of weekly assignments by the class's census date (09/07/21), or by its drop date, you will be automatically dropped from the class for nonparticipation.

Late assignments policy:

Assignments will be submitted on Canvas. Assignments that are submitted late will have 10% of total points deducted for every week they are overdue. Assignment submitted less than or equal to 1 week overdue = 10 points detracted; submitted less than or equal to 2 weeks overdue = 20 points detracted, and so on. Assignments submitted 5 or more weeks' late will still be accepted for a flat score of 50%.

Exams

The three exams in this class will be taken on Canvas. Sections will be timed. Questions include image identification, multiple choice, visual analysis, and short essay responses. A study guide will be circulated prior to each exam. Exams are not cumulative.

Exam make-up

If there is a documentable reason why you will need to miss an exam (medical / legal appointment, family death / illness, unavoidable schedule conflict), communicate this to the instructor **in advance** and request alternate arrangements. Missing an exam without a documented reason and prior consultation with the instructor will result in a grade of zero being awarded.

Contributing to the discussion forum

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Each week you will contribute to an online discussion forum and respond to one of your classmates' posts. Primary posts are worth 7 points; response posts are worth 3 points for a weekly total of ten possible points. There will be 14 discussion questions for a total of 140 points.
