Course Objective: As a result of completing this course you will be able to render objects naturalistically using basic drawing strategies which include: contour drawing, gesture drawing, tonal observation, shading, value, texture, composition, and the use of linear perspective. In addition this course will endow you with an increased sensitivity in your ability to *see*, as well as provide you with a broadened drawing vocabulary.

Also feel free to bring additional materials if you like, but please do not show up empty handed to class or mooch supplies from other students.

Class Conduct: I strongly insist upon a professional and studious atmosphere in the classroom. Do not constantly arrive late, leave early, chat incessantly, text, use cell phones or do anything else to regularly disrupt the other students. I usually play music for the class though you are welcome to use headphones to listen to your own music during work time. Finally, please take advantage of my help by asking questions and getting feedback. I always make myself available to you through out the class and am happy to assist!

Graphite pencils: 2h, 2b, and 4b 1 Solid Graphite Stick or a woodless graphite pencil (check out the water soluble ones) 1 Faber-Castell "Dust Free" eraser 1 Staedtler Mars plastic eraser or similar 1-2 gray kneadable erasers 2- glue sticks 1 pad of **18"X24**" white drawing paper (the Strathmore 400 drawing series is good) 1 pad of 18"X24" rough newsprint A portfolio at least 19"X25" (the folding cardboard "taco style" one is best) Compressed charcoal, 3 sticks (get the Alt Alternative brand) Compressed white charcoal, 3 sticks Medium set of colored chalk pastels (24 count is best, I recommend the *ProArt* brand) Small "break off" type utility knife 24" or 36" metal ruler 2 black charcoal Pencils (one HB, one 3B), get the *Ritmo* or *Primo* brand. 1 white charcoal pencil, also *Ritmo* or *Primo* brand. 1 sheet Gray toned paper 1 sheet of a mid tone color paper (your choice) 12 sheets of glassine paper (at least 18"X24") 1 can of spray fixative (professional re-workable fixative, or inexpensive hair spray) 1 roll of brown postal wrap 2 black bic pens Several pages of newspaper (just the black and white pages, preferably small print) Roll of Masking Tape A Sharpie: for block prints, and to write your name on your supplies! (one with both the fine and extra fine points is ideal!)
