Additionally, you can take the quizzes as many times as you want. They are there to help you understand the readings and identify what is most important in the texts.

Your participation in online discussion boards on canvas will also be graded. I strongly recommend that you log into Canvas at least once a week and keep up with the modules and due dates. If you do that, you will not be overwhelmed with work at the end of the term.

There will be a final paper due at the end of the term, and a few other shorter writing assignments. You will earn points along the way doing the prep work for the final paper. If you are unhappy with your grade on any assignment, you may revise it and resubmit.

While I grade a little more generously when assignments are handed in on time, I do not deduct points for late assignments. I will accept missing assignments until the last day of class.

I do grade with a curve, so the final letter grade is not as simple at 90% is an A, 80% is a B, although it will be close to that. If you are curious at any point exactly what grade you are currently earning, just email me and I will tell you.
