A noncredit course providing an overview of the four academic subject areas that comprise the 2014 GED and other high school equivalency tests (i.e., Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science). Computer skills necessary for passing current high school equivalency tests will also be covered. Through the use of diagnostic pretests, course content will emphasize students' needs.

Class Content

We will cover the following course outcomes and concepts:

- 1. Review the fundamentals of High school mathematics (i.e., fractions, decimals, percents, geometry, probability/statistics and algebra) and its application to high school equivalency tests.
- 2. Review the fundamentals of high school science (i.e., life science, biology, physical science) and its application to high school equivalency tests.
- 3. Review the fundamentals of high school social studies (i.e., U.S. History, world history, economics, civics, government, and geography) and its application to high school equivalency tests.
- 4. Review the fundamentals of high school language arts (i.e., english mechanics, sentence structure, paragraph formation, essay formats, reading comprehension and critical thinking) and its application to high school equivalency tests.
- 5. Use a calculator.
- 6. Basic computer usage.
- 7. Effective study and test-taking skills.
- 8. Read and follow instructions.
