## Prerequisites / Co-requisites / Recommended Preparation

EDUC 210 (or equivalent)

For some populations, taking EDUC 210 prior to entering EDUC 225 will be necessary. EDUC 210 is preparation for the GED class, but not all students will need it. Students that have a solid Elementary level education can enter into EDUC 225 without EDUC 210.
