Catalog Description

Introduction to environmental issues from a scientific perspective, focusing on physical, chemical, and biological processes within the Earth system, the interaction between humans and these processes, and the role of science in finding sustainable solutions. Topics include ecological principles, biodiversity, climate change, sustainability, renewable and non-renewable energy, water resources, air and water pollution, and solid waste management.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- 1. Apply the process of science to analyze major environmental issues at a variety of scales, identify potential solutions for these issues and evaluate the viability of these solutions.
- 2. Analyze and interpret quantitative data and visual representations of data describing an environmental issue.
- 3. Describe the relationships between human actions and environmental issues and predict potential outcomes of these interactions.
- 4. LAB: Analyze and interpret human influences on an ecosystem in the field.

There are no pre-requisites for this course. However, you will be asked to do a lot of reading and writing. If these are areas you struggle with, consider taking a college-level English course prior to or concurrently with ENVSC-10.

Assignment Weights:

- 1. Labs (25%) Labs will include independent fieldtrips, virtual fieldtrips, and research assignments. You'll have an assignment or discussion post to complete for lab each week.
- 2. **Discussions (20%)** These are my way of both ensuring that you are watching the lectures and engaging in the course content with your classmates. You will have to make an initial post answering a prompt about the week's lectures or homework to "open" the discussion forum and see other students' responses. Once the forum is open, you'll have a response requirement that will be detailed in the description of the discussion forum.
- 3. **Individual Research Project (25%)** You will research an environmental science topic, write a short literature review, and communicate your findings with an infographic.
- **1. Exams (30%)** There will be two midterm exams throughout the semester that cover material from both lecture and lab. There will also be a comprehensive final exam.
