Catalog Description

This course provides the skills and knowledge needed for the entry-level firefighter to perform their duties safely, effectively and competently. The curriculum is based on Cal Fire policy, the 2013 edition of NFPA 1001 Standards for Firefighter Professional Qualifications, and the 2008 edition of NFPA 472 Standards for Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials / Weapons of Mass Destruction Incidents. The seven overarching themes of the Firefighter I curriculum are: 1) general knowledge, 2) fire department communications, 3) fireground operations, 4) rescue operations, 5) preparedness and maintenance, 6) wildland suppression activities, 7) hazardous materials / WMD.

- 4. Public Safety shall relay threat information, warnings, and alerts through the Everbridge emergency alert system, Public address system, and when possible, updates on the college website, to ensure the school community is notified.
- 5. Follow established procedures for the specific emergency as outlined in the College of the Redwoods Emergency Procedure Booklet, (evacuation to a safe zone, shelter in place, lockdown, assist others if possible, cooperate with First Responders, etc.).
- 6. If safe to do so, notify key administrators, departments, and personnel.
- 7. Do not leave campus, unless it is necessary to preserve life and/or has been deemed safe by the person in command.

Klamath Trinity Campus Emergency Procedures

- 1. In the event of an emergency, communication shall be the responsibility of the district employees on scene.

 - b. If safe to do so, notify key administrators, departments, and personnel.
 - c. If safe to do so, personnel shall relay threat information, warnings, to ensure the school community is notified.
 - d. Contact 530-625-4821 to notify of situation.
 - e. Contact Hoopa Tribal Education Administration office 530-625-4413
 - f. Notify Public Safety 707-476-4111.
- 2. In the event of an emergency, the responsible district employee on scene will:
 - a. Follow established procedures for the specific emergency as outlined in the College of the Redwoods Emergency Procedure Booklet.
 - b. Lock all doors and turn off lights if in lockdown due to an active shooter or similar emergency.
 - c. Close all window curtains.
 - d. Get all inside to safe location Kitchen area is best internal location.
 - e. If a police officer or higher official arrives, they will assume command.
 - f. Wait until notice of all is clear before unlocking doors.
 - g. If safe to do so, move to the nearest evacuation point outside building (Pooky's Park), directly behind the Hoopa Tribal Education Building.
 - h. Do not leave site, unless it has been deemed safe by the person in command. Student Support Services (required for online classes)

Course Description: This course provides the skills and knowledge needed for the entry-level firefighter to perform his/her duties safely, effectively, and competently. The curriculum is based on Cal Fire policy, the 2013 edition of NFPA 1001 Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications, and the 2008 edition of NFPA 472 Standard for Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials / Weapons of Mass Destruction Incidents. The seven overarching themes of the Basic Firefighter curriculum are: general knowledge pertinent to the profession, fire department communications, fire ground operations, rescue operations, preparedness and maintenance, wildland fire suppression activities, and hazardous materials / WMD. This is a for Credit course (9 units).

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Safely function as entry-level firefighter in wildland, structural fire, and rescue situations.
- Be able to effectively don and remove Personal Protective Equipment.
- Safe and effective use of tools and equipment.
- Know and understand the importance of following instructions, the chain of command and team-work.

Successfully complete all performance skills testing.

Successfully complete all instructional skills until proficient.

Expectations and Orientation

- You will be expected to follow all rules, posted signs and traffic laws while on the College of the Redwoods facilities. Failure to follow laws and rules will result in a citation.
- You are representing the College of the Redwoods, Cal Fire and your academy class. Your actions whether good or bad reflect on the reputation of the college, Cal Fire and your fellow students. You will respect staff, instructors and other students at all times. This academy focuses on following instructions and teamwork, there is no "I" in teamwork. If you have trouble working with others, acting responsibly and following directions this may not be the place for you.
- You will be expected to adhere to Cal Fire grooming standards for the duration of the academy. See attached Grooming Standards No. 87 July 2002
- You will be expected to attend and participate in all activities and class days. This includes physical training, set-up and clean-up of daily activities.
- You will need to bring exercise clothing to participate in the Physical Training. (Running shoes, shorts, and T shirt, etc.) Daily physical fitness participation is mandatory during the academy. If you are not actively engaged in a well-rounded fitness routine that includes strength training, cardiovascular conditioning and flexibility, it is strongly recommended that you do so immediately. (PT will be the first hour of each class day: rain or shine)
- You will be expected to be on time for all activities and class days. If you are unable to attend because of sickness, family emergency, etc., you will notify the academy coordinator by phone (707) 476-4541. Leaving a message describing what the issue for your absence entails.
- You will be expected to be in uniform for all activities and class days.

 Uniform button up shirts and pants for classroom, uniform T-shirt and pants for other activities, and physical training T-shirt, sweat shirt, black shorts and / or black sweat pants.
- In order to successfully complete this course you will need to attain a minimum score of 80% on all summative (Mid-Term and Final) tests. You will need to successfully complete all activities and formative (quizzes to

- see how you are doing) tests. You will need to complete all performance skill testing and successfully complete all instructional skills until proficient.
- You will need a Doctor's release letter stating that you are clear to
 participate in physical training and the arduous activities that are involved
 in this course. Without this release you will not be able to enroll in the
 course.
- You will be responsible for equipment and materials loaned to you during this academy. Loss of or damage to equipment is the responsibility of the individual student, and appropriate fees will be charged to the student by the College of the Redwoods and or vendor.
- If your Fire Chief approves the use of department PPE/SCBA, you must inform him/her that the equipment will be damaged and may not be serviceable after the academy. College of the Redwoods is not responsible for any damage. A signed letter from your Chief authorizing the use of department PPE must be returned to the Fire Academy Director. All equipment must be NFPA compliant.
- College of the Redwoods does not provide personal lockers for your academy equipment. You are responsible for transporting your gear to school every day, and having it available at all times. DO NOT leave equipment visible in your vehicle. Lock items in your trunk.
- Academic Misconduct: The fire service is respected for its' honesty, and its' professional conduct must be above question. Cheating, plagiarism, collusion, abuse of resource materials, computer misuse, fabrication or falsification, multiple submissions, complicity in Academic misconduct, and or bearing false witness will not be tolerated. Violation will be dealt with according to the procedures and sanctions proscribed by College of the Redwoods. Students caught plagiarizing or cheating on exams will be dismissed from the academy.
