Catalog Description

A course designed to teach theory and detailed demonstration of the first aid/CPR/AED care of the injured. This includes an assessment and intervention of an individual's condition and incorporation of proper treatment. Standard American Red Cross first aid, CPR, and AED certification granted upon successful completion of requirements. Note: To receive a course completion certification from the American Red Cross, students need to be physically able to properly perform and demonstrate rescue skills.

Course Student Learning Outcomes:

1. Assess victims of injury and medical emergencies and apply emergency action plan.

- 2. Describe the signs and symptoms, and demonstrate first aid care needed in common medical emergencies
- 3. Demonstrate cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of AED.
- 4. Explain care for special situations and demonstrate emergency rescue moves, bandaging, and splinting.

Grading:

Attendance policy: Attendance is required for success in this course. There will be points given in many class sessions throughout the semester. You need to be present to receive the points. Assignments: Most of the assignments in this class are done while in class. Late assignments will not be accepted, and extra credit is given sparingly.

Tests/Quizzes: Quizzes will often be based on class discussions and lectures and may occur at any time during class or assigned in Canvas (all students are required to use Canvas). Tests are announced in advance and usually a combination of True/False, Multiple Choice, Fill-in the

blank, and short answer questions. If necessary, make-up tests MUST be arranged prior to the test date.

First Aid, CPR, and AED skill assessments are based on the American Red Cross standards.

Your final grade will be based on the total points you have earned throughout the semester. After each assignment is graded, your point value will be posted into the Canvas grade book. I am not a fan of the plus or minus system in grading. Occasionally, I may give a plus, but rarely a minus. Back in the Stone Age, when I was a student, I was not fond of the fact that 80% was below a 3.0 on the grade point average.

In the event of an emergency:

- 1. Evaluate the impact the emergency has on your activity/operation and take appropriate action.
- 2. Dial 911, to notify local agency support such as law enforcement or fire services.
- 3. Notify Public Safety 707-476-4111 and inform them of the situation, with as much relevant information as possible.
- 4. Public Safety shall relay threat information, warnings, and alerts through the Everbridge emergency alert system, public address system, and when possible, updates on the college website, to ensure the school community is notified.
- 5. Follow established procedures for the specific emergency as outlined in the College of the Redwoods Emergency Procedure Booklet, (evacuation to a safe zone, shelter in place, lockdown, assist others, if possible, cooperate with First Responders, etc.).
- 6. If safe to do so, notify key administrators, departments, and personnel.
- 7. Do not leave campus unless it is necessary to preserve life and/or has been deemed safe by the person in command.
