#### **Catalog Description**

This is the didactic portion of a 14-week course focused on preparing the student to work as a Medical Assistant in private or public medical offices, clinics, hospital based-clinics, specialty offices, and other health care facilities. The course covers basic medical office procedures. It also includes medical terminology, point of care testing, (CLIA) waived laboratory testing, documentation, including electronic health records, and equipment management.

#### Course Student Learning Outcomes (from course outline of record)

- 1. The student will demonstrate knowledge of and the ability to perform front and back office medical procedures.
- 2. The student will be able to demonstrate learning through scoring on quizzes and tests showing they have the knowledge to successfully pass the national Clinical Certified Medical Assisting (CCMA) examination.
- 3. The student will demonstrate through testing and skills demonstration that they are a viable candidate for employment in a medical/health care facility.

## **Evaluation & Grading Policy**

Grading of The Spring 2022 Medical Assisting classis a pass/fail class and is divided into 3 sections, each one representing approximately  $1/3^{rd}$  of your grade.

The Academic section includes all Assignments, Quizzes, Discussions and Attendance. The points will be tallied and a score of 70% will be required to pass. Please note, Discussions are due on the last Friday of the current Module, and Quizzes are due on the last Saturday. As a rule, late Quizzes and discussions are **not accepted** and will result in a 0 grade. Any exemptions must be arranged with the instructor in advance.

The Lab grade is based on the assessment of your performance of the instructed lab skills and is also pass/fail. You must be able to demonstrate proficiency in all of the labs. Successful completion of CPR, Injections and Venipuncture entitle you to certificates in those skills. **All health and safety rules will be strictly enforced!** 

Note: Labs cannot be repeated due to the tight time frame of the class and availability of the lab space. Please do not miss a lab, it is unlikely that you will be able to pass the class if you do.

The Mid-Term and the Final Exam will be held in person at the D Street classroom. The questions will be multiple choice, taken from our 2 textbooks, and will be representational of the National Examination. You must pass each one with a grade of 70% or higher.

- 7. Do not leave campus, unless it is necessary to preserve life and/or has been deemed safe by the person in command.

# **Klamath Trinity Campus Emergency Procedures**

Please review the responsibilities of, and procedures used by, the College of the Redwoods, Klamath-Trinity Instructional Site (KTIS) to communicate to faculty, staff, students and the general public during an emergency.   - f. Notify Public Safety 707-476-4111.
- 2. In the event of an emergency, the responsible district employee on scene will:
  - a. Follow established procedures for the specific emergency as outlined in the College of the Redwoods Emergency Procedure Booklet.
  - b. Lock all doors and turn off lights if in lockdown due to an active shooter or similar emergency.
  - c. Close all window curtains.
  - d. Get all inside to safe location Kitchen area is best internal location.
  - e. If a police officer or higher official arrives, they will assume command.
  - f. Wait until notice of all is clear before unlocking doors.
  - g. If safe to do so, move to the nearest evacuation point outside building (Pooky's Park), directly behind the Hoopa Tribal Education Building.
  - h. Do not leave site, unless it has been deemed safe by the person in command. Student Support Services (required for online classes)
