Catalog Description

A course designed to enhance the application of teamwork, fitness, technical and tactical knowledge as well as improving playing ability. An understanding of critical fundamental skills, elements, and body movements to improve playing knowledge. The use of small-sided practice to improve positional elements for all level players in order to succeed in the intercollegiate level. Students will be helped to improve and maintain an understanding of the fundamental skills and rules for participation in the sport, and to develop a lasting interest in the sport of soccer.

Course Student Learning Outcomes (*from course outline of record*)

1. Students will learn the rules of soccer, positions of the team, and basic strategies during all game situations. 2. Students will learn how to effectively receive a pass and how to pass. 3. Students will learn a variety of defensive and offensive strategies. 4. Students will learn and demonstrate how to use techniques and strategies in regular soccer game and small sided games with advanced proficiency. 5. Students will learn the proper mechanics of running, footwork, passing, dribbling, throw-ins and shooting in dynamic competitive situations. 6. Students will learn how to perform proper defensive technique and positioning and apply these techniques while defending offensive players. 7. Students will learn the use of proper angles in pursuit of the ball.
