Catalog Description

A fun and challenging experience that explores hiking trails in your surrounding areas. This course will introduce safe hiking on terrain that will progress from easy and moderate to strenuous throughout the semester. Hikes will typically range from 3-8 miles on each outing and require a 25-minute per mile pace. Leadership and nature activities exploring safety, leave no trace, history, flora and fauna and emergency procedures will be introduced.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Describe the types of conditions necessary for hiking.
- Demonstrate the ability to hike for 30 minutes
- Identify essential hiking equipment and explain its proper use for different terrains and weather

conditions.

- Plan a safe and appropriate hiking route using maps, GPS tools, and online resources.
- Apply basic navigation skills, including map reading and compass or GPS use.

Evaluation and Grading Policy

Students will be evaluated based on active participation in course activities and consistent evidence of completing weekly hikes. Participation includes engagement in online discussions, submission of required reflections or logs, and timely completion of assigned activities. Weekly hike completion must be demonstrated through approved documentation, such as activity logs, photos, GPS data, or written reflections.

1. Grading Breakdown

- Participation & Attendance: 100%
- Criteria: Actively participating in weekly hikes. (5 points every week for showing proof of going on a hike through the Strava app. No make ups) Students will earn **5 points each week** for submitting proof of completing a hike using the **Strava app**. Proof must clearly show the date, duration, and distance of the hike. Submissions must be made by the weekly deadline. **No make-up submissions will be accepted** for missed or late hikes.

2. Final Grade calculation

Final grades will be calculated based on the weighed percentages of each component:

- **Participation & Attendance: 100%**
