- 1. Writing Prompt / Free Writing
- 2. Writing Prompt Discussion
- 3. Lecture: Lectures will vary. We will cover topics including:
  - Build vocabulary diversity in reading and writing.
  - Demonstrate active listening behavior.
  - Demonstrate word attack skills.
  - Use context clues to increase reading comprehension.
  - Evaluate, question and critically respond to nonfiction and fictional texts orally and in writing.
  - Recognize and demonstrate main ideas and support in reading and writing.
  - Increase reading variety and fluency.
  - Organize ideas through individual, partner and class collaborative assignments.
  - Write with purpose and coherence.
  - Examine writing through individual and peer collaboration.
  - Revise and finalize writing after critical review.
  - Include appropriate transitions with clear, organized paragraphs in writing.
  - Evaluate texts for purpose and audience.
