## **Catalog Description**

A course introducing the basics of American Sign Language (ASL) through exposure to questions, commands, and other simple sentence structures. It is expected that students will develop rudimentary conversational skill in ASL. Additionally, information about Deaf culture will be introduced.

- 1. Demonstrate basic linguistic skills in American Sign Language to communicate utilizing expressive and interpretive (receptive) skills.
- 2. Demonstrate awareness of Deaf culture and community.
