How to find out courses you need for your Associate Degree or Certificate:

Find general education and degree requirements all in one place on your <u>WebAdvisor</u> account under **Academic Planning>Program Evaluation.** You can either view what you need for an assigned program, or find out what you would need for a different major and/or type of general education pattern by choosing from one of the several programs we offer under the **What If** drop down.

How to find what classes you need for transfer:

If you are planning to transfer other CSUs or a UC, become familiar with this site! Use the *"Transfer Information"* drop downs to find major prep courses, articulation agreements, and admission requirements for all the UC and CSU campuses and majors. Combine the information you find here with the GE patterns and requirements for our Liberal Arts or Associate Degrees for Transfer to get an Associate Degree at the same time you are ready to transfer to the next school.

Important petitions and deadlines for receiving your degree:

In order to receive your degree, you are responsible for notifying the college through a simple petition the semester you plan to complete your program of study. Graduation petitions are found on the CR website under <u>Admissions and Records</u>> Forms>Graduation Forms> <u>Graduation Petition</u> or <u>Certificate Petition</u>.

Fall petition deadline- Last Thursday of Oct Spring petition deadline - First Thursday in March Summer petition deadline - Last Thursday in June

Fall CSU Applications: Apply to CSUs in the Fall to attend the following Fall: Oct 1-Nov 30 (www.calstate.edu/apply)Fall UC Applications: Apply to UC in the Fall to attend the following Fall: Nov 1-30 (http://www.universityofcalifornia.edu)Spring/Winter Applications: Many CSUs accept spring applications between Aug 1-Aug 31st. Check Cal State Apply or callthe schools' admissions department to see if your school accepts admissions in semesters other than Fall.
