COLLEGE OF THE REDWOODS FOOTBALL PROGRAM

College of the Redwoods' football program was founded in 1967 and since that time CR has won 3 state championships, 2 Northern California Championships, and 11 conference championships. Hundreds of CR players have gone on to play for 4-year institutions and many have gone on to play for professional teams whether that be in the Arena Football League, Canadian Football League, or the National Football League.

CR Football currently plays in the Pacific 7 Conference of the Northern California Football Conference (NCFC) of the California Community College Athletic Association and has an average roster size of 80+ players.

OUR GOALS

- We want our student athletes to have a quality experience while attending College of the Redwoods, both athletically and educationally.
- We want our student athletes to graduate with an Associate's Degree and have the opportunity to transfer to a four-year institution.
- Our football program will foster strong relationships with CR faculty and staff, Humboldt and Del Norte high schools, and with our local communities.
- We will recruit and sign 90% of the senior HDN student-athletes who intend to play college football.

MEET OUR **COACHING STAFF**



JASON WHITE HEAD COACH

Jason White was hired in April 2021 as College of the Redwoods new head football coach. White has 27 years of experience teaching and coaching at both the high school and collegiate level and has a master's degree in Kinesiology from Humboldt State University. White was an offensive lineman at both College of the Redwoods and Humboldt State University. He then went on to coach at CR for eight years - 2 years as the running backs coach, eight as the offensive line coach, and four as their offensive coordinator. Later, White moved on to coach at Humboldt State University, serving for five years as their offensive line coach and two as their assistant head coach. White then transitioned to coaching high school football as St. Bernard's High School Head Coach and seven years as Eureka High School's head coach. White is recognized in the community for his development of playoff and championship teams, and for his strong ties with local area high schools and businesses.



DAMARO WHEELER **DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR**

Coach Wheeler brings 16 years of coaching experience to CR. Damaro comes from South Dakota Mines football program where he was the special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach. Before South Dakota Mines, he served as the head coach at Humboldt State University in 2018. He joined the Lumberjacks coaching staff in the spring of 2017 as the defensive backs and special teams coordinator. Prior to Humboldt State, Wheeler served as defensive coordinator/ assistant head coach at College of the Redwoods. He helped the program's defense improve to 12th in the state in rushing yards per game and 20th in total yards per game. Wheeler also had coaching stops at the University of California, Davis (2012-14), Central Washington (2010-11), Southern Oregon (2007-09) and Mission Bay High School in San Diego, California (2004-05). He played collegiately at San Diego Mesa College and Azusa Pacific. Wheeler helped Azusa Pacific to an Independent Conference Championship in his final year of eligibility (2003).



SPECIAL PROGRAMS FOR OUR STUDENT ATHLETES

Cap and Gown Program

Cap and Gown is an academic support program. It provides an additional five hours per week of mandatory study and resource support to student athletes outside of their scheduled classes. The program includes tutoring support in both English and math, and dedicated faculty members to oversee students' academic progress. Emphasis is placed on students completing assignments on time and properly preparing for examinations through time management, critical thinking, and persistence. In addition to the instructors, coaches assist with keeping students focused on balancing studies and sports.
